## AGM Report

The AGM of the Highfield Donkeys Inc was held at Peter Coulings house in Algies Bay after being delayed due to Covid-19 regulations.

The Chairman reported that it had been a succesful year despite the impact of Covid 19 – a time capsule had been buried to be opened in 50 years from November 2019. He thanked all the committee for their work during the year, the Auckland Council for their barbeque support,

Financially we collected \$570 membership fees from 165 members, with total revenue of \$3,870.61 and total costs of \$2,325.4. \$8,487.51 was invested as at the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2020

Elected for the 2020/2021 year were Peter Couling (Chairman). Helen Whiteley(Secretary), Marion Jones(Treasurer) Peter Caccia-Birch and John Montgomery(Donkey Managers), Elizabeth Duhs (Membership Secretary), Jenny Van de Veeple(Roberts Family Representative), Chris Mellor(Donkey Serenade) and Jaine Kelsey(Committee member).



Leo van de Wijdeven who looks after our jac donkey, Teddy, for mating with our female donkeys gave an interesting account of his life at the Annual General Meeting of the Highfield Donkey Inc. He was brought up on a rural property in the Netherlands where his father, a truck driver, became a chicken farmer and trader and built a house that was more like a barn where Leos family lived for some time. It was cold, often -7°C.

At 7 years old after a 5 km ride from primary school he would work in the chicken, turkey, and rabbit abbatoir and could pack a chicken in 1 minute and skin a rabbit in 5 minutes. He left school at 12 years worked in a stocking factory, and then had a apprenticeship in a printing company where he grew to love graphic design. His father died when he was 20 and he had a year to go to finish his apprenticeship. He took over managing the farm but then had to serve his conscription in the army. This forced him to close down the farm and he donated the donkeys and dogs to an animal park. In the army he became a top driver which meant he was not posted overseas. While in the army he took photos of recruits. This became so succesful that became a professional photographer and photographed 1000 weddings over 6 years.

His brother had emigrated to New Zealand in the early 1970's and in 1977 he decided to visit New Zealand on holiday. Restrictions on residence in rural areas in the Netherlands led to him emigrating to New Zealand in 1984. He arrived with \$350 in his pocket and a pregnant wife of 6 months. He managed to obtain a job at McConnell through a chance meeting with the CEO. He rented out his house in the Netherlands and he and his wife left for New Zealand. After 6 months he soon found work as a printer. He then went onto to purchase a panel beating business and obtained a contract for repairing police cars. His wife became homesick and they returned to the Netherlands where he became a production manager for a newspaper. His wife after 2 years decided that New Zealand was a better place to live and they sold up everything in the Netherlands and returned to NZ.

He worked in several printing companies and in 1993 bought land in Cowns Bay, and built a house. He subsequently suffered illness through working in the printing industry and had to take permanent sick leave.

He planted 50,000 pine trees after work on this property and they have just been milled. He has suffered the loss of a finger when his previous donkey bit him while feeding. He now paints pictures and helps us breed donkeys
